The Further Education and Training Phase consists of Grades 10,11 and 12.

You have built a solid foundation in Grade 9 upon your future depends. FET Phase is the “BIG” school of secondary learning, where your skills are sharpened to prepare you for a career of your choice. Grades 10 to 12 form part of the FET learning phase where learners must decide on subjects that correlate with their career interests. The foundation from Senior Phase, along with career guidance advice provided during the enrolment process, equips learners to make these choices with ease.

At SA College, we provide our learners with tools and skills to assist them in selecting subjects that most correlate with their interests, considering their career choices.

FET Phase learners are preparing themselves for the great leap into tertiary and higher learning. At this phase, learners want to grasp the core foundation of what will determine their choice of studies at University, College or other Institution of Higher Learning. The FET Phase is a critical phase in that it is the launching pad for tertiary studies in their chosen fields and for entering the world of work.

It is at this phase that we focus on subject choices that are aligned to the learner’s career interests in Commerce, Humanities or Sciences.

Learners entering this phase must have reached maturity in their studies and the way they approach their studies. Young learners are expected to be self-motivated and reasonably certain of the subjects they have chosen during this phase.

During any time of Grade 10, a learner who is not achieving the academic standards of the school i.e., at least 50% in Mathematics and/or Physical Sciences is required to change subjects.

Please note all the subject offered at SA College are accredited by all universities in South Africa and count towards a Bachelor’s Degree Pass, which allows entry to university. To achieve a Bachelor’s Pass in Grade 12 a learner must achieve at least 50%+ in four subjects, one of which must be English Home Language and at least 30% in the Additional Language of choice. Life Orientation is the subject that no learner may fail.

Learners are required to attend extra classes at school in the afternoons and when necessary, over weekends and during school holidays. Grade 12 learners attend compulsory extra classes at school in the afternoons until 17:00, Saturday classes and during all school holidays.

We also insist that all our learners remain at school, until the last official day of school every term. Please consult the accompanying documents regarding the cultural and sports offered at the school. We believe that an involved participating learner is a happy learner.
